Analysis of Recognized Occupational Infectious Diseases in Germany Between 2018 and 2023

Key Findings

- 71.5% of cases occurred in healthcare, welfare, or laboratory settings
- Parasitic diseases (57%) and tuberculosis (35%) were the predominant infections in these sectors
- *Borrelia burgdorferi* (Lyme disease) was the most common zoonotic pathogen (41-58% of cases)
- *Plasmodium falciparum* (malaria) accounted for 52% of tropical disease cases

Conclusion

Most occupational infections are not vaccine-preventable, requiring focus on organizational controls, engineering measures, and infection control practices rather than pharmaceutical interventions.


Make Mentorship Connections
